5.     Report from Greg Banks on status of design and engineering.
  - A.     Tom Bauer has not responded with the weight of installed brick per square foot.
  - B.     Have a contact for marble if we want to use in the satellite memorials. Concrete is the least expensive, marble is in the middle of the road price wise and bronze is the most expensive.
  - C.     Two separate structural engineers are looking over the project to see if they want to be involved. Will try to get the work done pro bono.
  - D.     City of Thornton is trying to determine cost of engineering tank with memorial above and who will pay for additional costs. They are looking at what it would take to reinforce tank and cost so we can determine if it is an expense we wish to bear or look at moving the location of the memorial in the park.
6.     Rebecca Cavanaugh-Miller made a motion that the 4" x 8" bricks will be limited to three lines and be sold for \$100.00. Trudie Schultz seconded the motion. It was approved 8 to 3.
